A special flight will be arranged should there be sufficient passengers. Members are asked to inform the Secretary, National Committee, Grohova 7, Brno, ČSSR by July 1st of the day and time of their arrival at Prague.

The Gottwaldov (Holešov) airport is 40 minutes drive from the Hotel Moskva. Members will be met by car or autobus.

Members travelling by train should book to Gottwaldov-Otrokovice, which is 20 minutes bus drive from the hotel. Those who wish to be met should inform the Secretary, as above.

Customs.

It is recommended that recording machines, musical instruments and cameras should be declared on arrival in Czechoslovakia and a receipt obtained from the customs official.

There will be an exchange bureau at Gottwaldov.

Participants from countries which do not belong to the sterling and dollar areas should provide themselves from a bank in their own country with £1 10s. 0d. in sterling for payment of the registration fee and also £1 10s. 0d. for IFMC membership subscription if this has not already been paid.

Participants from the sterling and dollar areas are advised to change at the frontier only sufficient money for their immediate needs.

Exhibits.

Facilities will be given to members for the display of small exhibits such as books, leaflets, gramophone records, etc. Such exhibits, together with a list, should be given to the Conference Secretariat as soon as possible after arrival. Owners of the exhibits will be required to make their own arrangements for the removal of the material at the end of the Conference.

Climate and Dress.

As the weather is likely to be warm, members are advised to bring light-weight clothing, and also some warmer clothing and, in particular, a rain-coat, as the Festival performances are given out of doors.

Formal dress will not be required.
