Update on the publication of the Chiayi Symposium Proceedings

Mark van Tongeren presented the update on the publication of the Chiayi Symposium Proceedings.

Launch of the Nomination Process for the Executive Board

- Yuh-Fen Tseng announced official start of the nomination process for the next executive committee. The election will take place during the 49th ICTMD conference in San Diego, Chile in January 2027. As some study group members were unable to attend the meeting, the nomination process was extended by two weeks. The secretariat will send an email announcement to members.
- Shuo Niki Yang introduced and recommended Christian Poske to serve as the next chair of the study group. Poske accepted the nomination.
- Shuo Niki Yang introduced Chun-Chia Tai, who had self-nominated for the position of vice chair, but was unable to attend the meeting.
- Xinjie Chen introduced and recommended Chia-Yin Hung to serve as the next secretariat of the study group. Hung accepted the nomination.

Discussion on the Next IMD Symposium

The group discussed possible directions and locations for the next IMD Symposium.

- Christian Poske suggested organizing a joint symposium with the ICTMD Study Group on Sacred and Spiritual Sounds and Practices.
- DJ Hatfield suggested considering expansion beyond Asia to strengthen the group's international representation. Possible regions mentioned include Canada, Latin America and South America.
- Sayeem Rana suggested that Bangladesh should be considered as the location for the next symposium.
- The group acknowledged the value of all suggestions and agreed to continue exploring other possibilities and communicating with potential partners.
